Encouraged by the Hope25 initiative, we have sought to bring this focus to our whole year however as we approach **Pentecost Sunday** (8th June) let us be praying not only for our church community, but the communities across Australia who are actively seeking to share hope during this period.

The Preparation

Our preparation for Hope25 began with our February sermon series, 'Steps to Loving our Church' as a foundation for reaching out and welcoming others. It was great to see Connect groups using the study group material alongside this. In March, we had Stephen Abbott lead us in his course- 'Everyday Evangelism'.

The Hope25 Training Day for our area took place at GWAC and it was great to see many from our congregations taking part. I led a seminar on 'God conversations'.





In the lead up to Easter, our sermon series was based on the Gospel of Mark, and gave both, opportunities to share the gospel with those who don't yet know Jesus, and also further equip Christians to share their faith by reading the gospel with others.

Our Hope25 six-week season commenced with Bishop Paul Barker coming to preach across our English Sunday services and begin our evangelistic series on the book of Ecclesiastes which prompts us to contemplate our purpose in this life.

The upcoming Trivia night (31 May) gives us a great opportunity to invite friends and family who don't normally come to church services to connect with our church family.

Bishop John and I will be presenting a 'Planning your Funeral' seminar in June which is designed for both, church members, and also those outside our church community.

We are working towards holding a school holidays outreach program for children and families in the winter school holidays.

Praise God for exceptional fruit from the Mandarin Alpha Course with eight people giving their life to Jesus and many others came to know more about the good news of Jesus! In August we will run an outreach course (similar to Alpha) called 'Taste and See'. It is a four-week exploration of the gospel over a shared dinner.

Sharing our hope involves a whole lifestyle change, individually and corporately. Firstly, we need to be growing as a disciples, we need to know God's word, grow in it and share it. Secondly, we need to be welcoming others and sharing the gospel through relationship. Thirdly, we need to be prepared and willing to go deeper in our conversations with others and grow in our listening. Lastly, we need to be prepared to give an answer for the hope that we have!

ANGLICAN OVERSEAS AID (AOA) VISIT TO GWAC IN JUNE



On Sunday 15th June, at GWAC, hear from Anglican Overseas Aid's CEO- **Jo Knight** about the part GWAC can play in creating a renewed, restored world, free from poverty.

Jo has been CEO of Anglican Overseas Aid for three years and brings two decades' experience in global justice and environmental sustainability initiatives,



along with church and public engagement. She is a member of the Micah Australia Board and currently serves in global church governance as co-convenor of the ACT Alliance Membership and Nominations international committee.

Jo is married to Peter Carolane, the Senior Minister of Merri Creek Anglican, and they have two school-aged boys. Jo's forthcoming book, *Called to Care: A Christian response to the climate challenge of our generation*, will be released by IVP (UK) in November this year.

Anglican Overseas Aid's work transforms communities to alleviate the pressures of poverty and works in partnership with Anglicans and churches who are leading change in their local communities. Diocesan Safety Audits

The diocese has instituted quarterly inspections for all parishes. After some initial teething problems with communication and expectations with the company the system is now beginning to operate well. A meeting held at GWAC with the facilities team at the diocese was very productive and we were highly commended on the well-maintained grounds and the maintenance of the buildings. Our parish was described as an "exemplary example" to other parishes in the appearance and stewardship of our buildings. The Parsh Council would like to thank all the volunteers who assist in the mowing and general care of the grounds, and to Stephen Giles who works so faithfully in the stewardship of our buildings.

The Parish Council are actively working on the new Parish goals and vision. The staff and Parish council have undertaken a SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) of GWAC's ministry.
