Good works justify faith, but not the person. How is this a helpful distinction? What errors does it guard against?

Philippians 3:9 says "righteousness comes from God on the basis of faith." Can you explain what it means to receive Christ's righteousness, without using the word, "righteousness", or any other words a non-believer would likely not be familiar with.

Philippians 3:10-4:1

How does considering your future life in Christ's kingdom, after he returns, encourage you to live as a citizen of that kingdom today?
